Evidence of Military Abuse of the Herbicide "Glyphosate"

In Kelsterbach, a Frankfurt/Main suburb, local mayor Manfred Ockel was caught red-handed employing the herbicide "glyphosate." Ockel's intent was to remove all bushes and shrubs from boundary forests near Frankfurt/Main airport preserved for the protection of neighbours against noise and dust, apparently for perceived security pretexts. Once Kelsterbach Citizen's Group began paying attention, Ockel alleged that his underwood clear cut had been to root out neophytes, foreign species conquering the livelihoods of local plants. This documentation proves that his excuses are phoney, and that the controversial herbicide was indeed employed for a purpose it was neither

Spruce stump mistreated with herbicide, as seen from the red tine running down at the sides. Without herbicide, the cross section of a spruce (Picea abies) is yellow. Spruces are unlikely to grow out again from stumps, making any further treatement expendable. However, Ockel ordered his workers to smear these stumps with herbicide, exposing unprepared workers to mortal risk since "glyphosate" is known to cause cancer. As an extra deterrent against activists walking around the forest later it is ineffective though, since this specific poison decomposes quickly after it was sprayed. Apparently Manfred Ockel was so incompetent to expose his own staff to higher danger than any activists he intended to hit with the measure.



Stumps of bushes cut without kneeling down remain severe stumbing risks, especially to children, for many years even after the poison decomposed. In addition to that, if the cut is not applied at the root directly above ground surface, occsionally bushes may regrow from the stumps. The application of the herbicide could have been avoided by kneeling down with the saw to make professional cuts, or an advance purchase of wide-range tools available for the purpose.



More stumps you would not like to walk into or fall over. Photographs had to be taken under poor light conditions in the early morning hours, in order to successfully avoid contact with airport security staff patrolling nearby forestry roads.

Expert opinion by Leonhard Bauer on Baumliste, the coordination platform of tree activist training,

describing Ockel's alleged crusade against black cherry (Prunus serotina) as an empty pretext. The statement also points out that in fact there has been a sharp increase in usury plants like blackberries (Rubus sectio Rubus) in this forest, but for more than a decade Manfred Ockel was not interested in the expert opinion of Thomas Norgall, who had elaborated that their excessive growth resulted from the above-average harvest of old-growth trees leaving too much sunlight to the ground. It furthermore cites Horst Karasek's chronicle of the 1980 forest occupation Startbahn West, "Das Dorf im Flörsheimer Wald," in which Karasek tells of a guest who cut live trees at knee's height for building his hut, and reports that enraged activists compared this to the misbehaviour of German occupation soldiers in Russia during the World War, who were merely interested to clear out their shooting ranges. None of the other experts on Baumliste had to supplement additional remarks on the case.




