1. ADM, Hornweg 6, Amsterdam.

Free space in the Western Harbour-area. Squatted for many years, place for concerts, lectures, bar/people's kitchen and much more. <http://www.admleeft.nl>

2. Antarctica, Amundsenweg 1

Squatted social centre and living space with give- away shop, movie-/ music- evenings and people's kitchen. <http://wgwamundsenweg.wordpress.com>

3. Binnenpret, 1e Schinkelstraat 14-16 :

** Anarchistische Bibliotheek/Anarchist Library*

Come borrow a book, read a magazine, have a coffee or just a chat. Many books available with topics like anarchism, squatting, art, anti-racism, prison struggle etc. The library is a project from the AGA, the Anarchist Group Amsterdam. ** Bollox*

Infocafe since 1984. Lots of counter information and great stories. There is free internet, a collection of political magazines and all kinds of nice consumptions. Coffee, thee, juice or tosties. ** OCCII, Amstelveenseweg 134*

Autonomous non-profit concert space that offers a safe haven for alternative, underground, non-commercial activities, based on the principles of equality, freedom and anti-conformity. The OCCII exists thanks to the hard, continuous, work of the squatter community and all it's freedom loving, non conformist, sympathizers...and does not allow itself to ever forget this. <http://occii.org>

4. Bajesdorp – HJE Wenckebachweg 16-18's gardens

5. Plantage Doklaan, Plantagedoklaan 8

6. Filmhuis Cavia, Van Hallstraat 52-I

Movie theatre with a very diverse program, from alternative movies to documentaries and specials about filmmakers or theme's. Purely run by volunteers since the start, more than 25 years ago. www.filmhuiscavia.nl

7. Het Fort van Sjakoo, Jodenbreestr. 24

Books to ignite the Fire. Het Fort van Sjakoo (Sjakoo's Fortress) is a non-commercial and voluntarily/ collectively run bookstore with a focus on critical and insurgent literature. Books, magazines, music, clothing, pins and patches and revolutionary coffee. From pirates to Punk Rock, and from RARA to Dada and from love letters to revolutionary rhetoric, we want to help you think of the best and prepare for the worst. 8. Joe's Garage, Pretoriusstraat 43

Squatted social center with a whole range of activities, run by volunteers, activists, neighbourhood people. KSU: Kraak Spreekuur

KSU- a quite 'dutch' phenomena, which is hard to translate in English; some say Squat Assistance, others Squat Information or consultation. The KSU's are support groups that offer information about squatting in general and direct assistance with preparing a squatting action. 9. Molli, Van Ostadestraat 55

Neighborhood squatter cafe located in the Pijp. Squatted in 1979 and legalized by now. The bar is run by a collective of volunteers with decision-making on a consensus basis. Regular barnights, people's kitchen on thursday, film evenings and info nights are also organized. Mondays 19.00 – 20.00 KSU (squatting assistance group) of Pijp, centre and west. <http://molli2.squat.net>

10. OT301, Overtoom 301

Former squat, now used as a multi-media alternative cultural centre. It is used in a range of ways, including as a venue for music and films, a non-profit print shop, artists workspace and an 'organic cultural kitchen' (a vegan restaurant) called De Peper. www.ot301.nl

11. Outpost, Jan Tooropstraat 35

Outpost is a squatted artist run exhibition space in Slotervaart. <http://slotervaartoutpost.wordpress.com>

Radio Patapoe 88.3 FM Amsterdam

patapoe is free radio with no censorship or commercial interests propagating free speech and new ways of thinking. 12. Vondelbunker, Vondelpark 8a (right entrance underneath/in the bridge)

Free space in a former bunker at Vondelpark. Expositions, movie- and discussion evenings and other creative and/or activist projects. The activities are coordinated by cultural collective Schijnheilig. Thursdays 20.00 Studenten squatting assistance group. <http://vondelbunker.nl> and <http://schijnheilig.org>

13. Spok: Speculatie Onderzoeks Kollektief, Spuistraat 5

Assistance group for people who want information on a house owner, like sales contracts or chamber of commerce documents. Wednesdays 20:00-21:00, www.speculanten.nl

14. De Valreep, Polderweg 620

Op de Valreep is a squatted former animal asylum that has been turned into a social center. It is owned by the local city council that has a deal with project developer OCP to turn over the building when they apply for building permits. OCP has never shown any intentions to do anything with the building and left it empty for many years before it was squatted. Now they want to turn this beautiful place into a home-selling office. Op de Valreep is fighting to keep this place for the neighbourhood. <http://valreep.org>

15. Vrankrijk. Spuistraat 216.

The infamous 'krakersbolwerk' is a political social center in the making. After a couple of years and a whole lotta trouble from the municipality of Amsterdam the Vrankrijk has finally obtained a new permit. The fresh collective is now preparing to open the place on a regular basis, aiming for diverse political and cultural program that will inspire and enrage, uniting mischief makers of all sorts in an epic battle against capitalism, kraakverbod and other such evils. 16. Zaal 100, De Wittenstraat 100

Independent centre with a diverse program, varying from amateur theatre, food and drinks, concerts,music improv, dans performances, poetry, expositions and all sorts of other obscure expressions for which its hard to find a space elsewhere. <http://zaal100.nl>

You know, that little monthly DIY underground cultural calendar that used to keep you updated on all the wild and angry places to hang out in town. As a farewell treat, we put our heads together one last time to present you with this Epic Battle Map.

What does the map offer? First of all, it contains a handy overview of all those non-commercial autonomous spaces that enrich this town. All of those people's kitchens, bars, cinemas, independent social and political spaces! places where authority is hated and community encouraged are now all on one map. Because despite the variety and differences - let them flower - we feel there's a tie that binds us together. So if you want to know what's going on in Amsterdam, beyond yuppie bars and shopping streets, grab this map and venture out there!

Furthermore, this map offers you a neat little overview of some very legitimate targets that we feel represent all those things we fight against. Unhindered by any realism, we've put it in comfortable black-and-white: the forces of Liberation bravely waving their Black and Red, Pink and Silver, Pirate, Rainbow, Purple or Green flags in their apocalyptic struggle against those suckers gathered under the Grey Blanket of Dreaminess and Business as Usual.

In it, you'll find the seven High Virtues of Resistance, Autonomy, Irony, Pleasure, Solidarity, Love and Hate - look to the Left - set against the Seven Deadly Sins: Obedience, Authority, Exploitation, Repressive Social Norms, Consumerism, Surveillance and Boredom - on the Right, of course.

So after getting inspired and organized in one of the many autonomous spaces, put some ideas into action! Be the Resistance. Paint bomb the Amsterdam sign, have a punk picnic at a VVD party conference, torch down De Nederlandsche Bank. Support illegalised people, free the animals, free your mind. Hang out with frh friends, swim and read a book. Bake apple pie. Dig holes under the surveillance machine, throw some bricks around wrapped in golden candy wrappers, send out furious or funny propaganda. Organise, distribute, plunder and loot. Keep on confusing them. Fuck the Fucking Fuckers. For a free and fun future. Starting right here and now.
